

To be eligible to receive services, you must:

- have a disability, injury, or health condition
- be between 14 and 67 years of age
- be an Australian resident
- not be studying full-time
- not be working at or above your assessed work capacity.

You do not need to be receiving an Income Support Payment to access support under Inclusive Employment Australia.

Your provider will work with you to understand your needs and work goals. Then they will match you with the right employer and job.


Inclusive Employment Australia providers have expertise working with people with a range of disabilities or backgrounds. You will get to choose your provider at any time.
